

Feedback from meeting on sustainable transport in France



Transport has a key stake in sustainable development



- Emissions of CO2
- Air pollution
- Accidents
- Noise
- Destruction of natural environments

Everyone needs to be conscious of the impact of their transport choices

Better communication about public transport

PT should compete more against the car lobby. Consumers see their car as freedom but don't realise:

- Cost
- Lost of time: traffic, parking etc.
- Stress
- Insecurity
- Polluting
- Young people should stop seeing the car as the easiest mode of transport
- Make the right choice!

Stop adapting cities to cars

- Set up strong inciting measures to encourage people to change their behaviour.
- Town should reduce spaces for cars and prioritize ecological transport (bikes, pedestrians, etc.)
- Set up a urban toll for cars like in London, Rome or Singapore
- Free car parks outside of towns.





Efficiency – Quality of life

PT should offer a credible alternative to cars.

- Expand the coverage of PT
- Rapidity
- Affordable
- Comfortable (regulate peak times!)
- Safe
- Practical: use of new technologies like information on sms, only 1 ticket for all, etc.

Intermodality

Because PT can't always compete with car (To go shopping, pick up children, visit friends etc.)

- To mitigate disadvantages of PT, they should be combined with new alternatives like carsharing.
- Possibility of attaching a bike at the back of the bus.
- No need to have a car.

If people have one, they would use it!

Sustainable Transport

PT should have as less impact as possible on climate change

- Use of biofuel and other renewable energy sources
- Replacement of old vehicles with new, more efficient ones





Development of sustainable transport needs to involve young people in decision-making process: it's our future at stake.
