'i-MOVE 2.0, THE business model for tomorrow?'

- Alongside improving service quality and increasing capacity for public transport, this requires a comprehensive review of the service portfolio and retail facilities.
- The generalised use of innovation and web-based applications, including for payments and travel information, will facilitate the use of buses, trains, bikes, taxis and car-sharing – which explains the slogan i-MOVE 2.0.
- Critical for the success of i-MOVE 2.0 will be organisational and financial arrangements.
- Brings about the **radical overall** of the sector that is necessary to double the public transport market share worldwide by 2025.



Programme will feature 6 main topical clusters:


- 1. Service design and portfolio service quality, innovations, brand...
- 2. Strategic management and integrated business processes faster project delivery, cost optimisation...
- **3. Funding model** fare policies, revenue support...
- 4. Governance and industry structures policy integration...
- 5. Smart city and mobility management land use, charges, green zones...
- **6.** The tools of Mobility 2.0 environmentally friendly vehicles, apps...




The programme will consist of:

- 3 plenary sessions: these will take place in a large auditorium with simultaneous interpretation into the main UITP languages.
- 18 parallel sessions: these will take place in large rooms with simultaneous interpretation into the main UITP languages.
- 15 Expo Forum sessions reserved for exhibitors Separate call issued later.
- 9 Regional workshops dedicated to development in the UITP regions and developed by the Regional Executive Committees

The duration of all sessions will be 90 minutes, including a discussion time of minimum 15 minutes.








- The programme is prepared by UITP on the basis of submitted material related to the 6 main topics.
- Deadline for submitted returns was 30 March 2012.
- 311 eligible papers, i.e. more than ever before (230 for Dubai 2011) - the i-MOVE 2.0 motto was well received.
- Proposals from over 50 countries all regions were well represented.
- Sustainable development featured in roughly 10% of returns mainly focused around greening transport through innovative technologies.


