Aiming to:

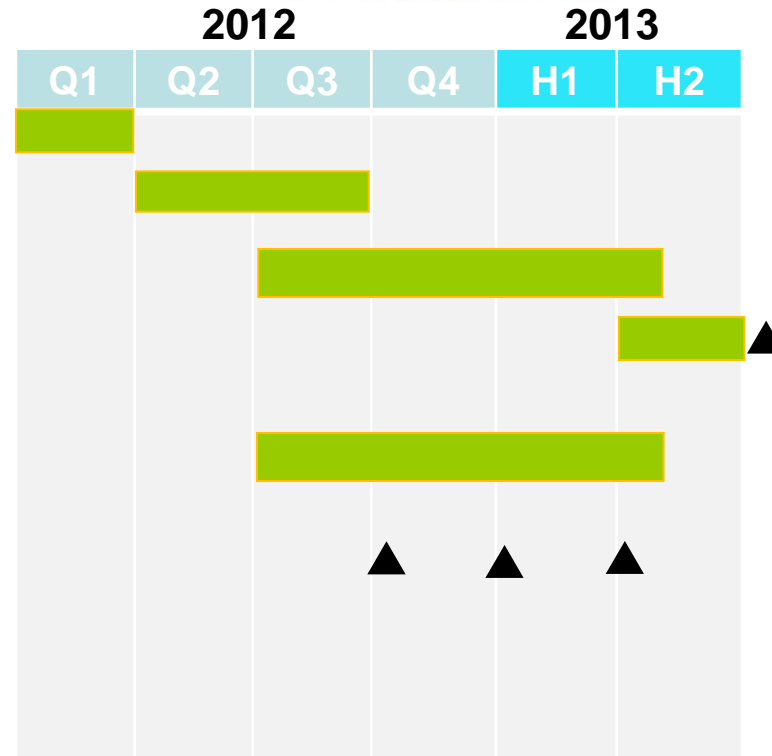
- Share a common (Authorities, Ops, Suppliers) understanding of ISO 26k (enabling contractual requirements)
