Nationally Determined Contributions (NDC)

A new legal agreement

Pre 2020 and long term finance

The Action Agenda

Or national climate plans covering commitments out to 2030 from over 180 countries. Specific **regulatory signals and investments** in key economies and markets.

For post 2020 climate regime applicable to all and addressing mitigation and adaptation. The political signal committing to long-term decarbonisation and pursuing efforts towards a 1,5 degrees scenario

\$100bn from public and private sources to drive the low GHG transition. Climate finance establishes **market signals** and financial incentives


Cooperative initiatives and individual commitments from state and non-state actors. UITP Declaration on Climate Leadership officially recognised in the Action Agenda

Ambition

+80 countries have now ratified the convention

More than 180 countries representing 97 percent of global greenhouse gas emissions have put forth national climate action plans. In addition non-state actors including business have pledged to reduce GHG emissions in unprecedented numbers through the so-called "action agenda".


Transport and INDCs



- 77% of INDCs call for mitigation action on transport
- 10% of INDCs include transport emission reduction target
- 14% of INDCs specify emission reduction potential

- 61% of INDCs propose mitigation measures
- Emphasis on 'Technological Improve measure' and urban transport
- Mitigation ambition level falls far short of 2 DS

PUBLIC TRANSPORT INTERVENTIONS IDENTIFIED IN NATIONAL CLIMATE PLANS



These are dependant on final support but also technical support and capacity building

TRANSPORT ACTION AREA



- 15 Transport Initiatives covering all modes of transport and all major regions
- If implemented at scale at least 50% of passenger and freight trips in 2025 would be affected





CORE MESSAGES FOR COP 22

- The public transport sector will continue to work towards the goals in the UITP Declaration but we still need to scale up efforts.
- Clear need for stronger political will, greater investments but importantly we need to mobilise action across a range of stakeholders and partnerships – UITP can play a key role in supporting this
- The NDC's move us in the right direction but we need to ensure quick-start implementation but also ensure the scale and quality of these investments.

CORE MESSAGES FOR COP 22

- Needs to be a two way dialogue with likeminded Parties and initiatives that share a joint vision to ensure interventions are of quality and are implemented quickly.
- UITP members will be responsible for the delivery of the public transport interventions in the NDC's
- UITP's Declaration can help learning of what works (technical support and capacity building) and show public transport interventions have impact.
- The climate agenda and the sustainable development agenda need to be brought together – SDG 11.2 includes a target on expanding public transport

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER COP 22

- 2018 review if national plans to see if what is pledged meets ambition possibly leading to a scaling up of national plans
- Focus on mechanisms that support implementation
- Action Agenda to run until 2020 and will continue to be engaged as part of the COP process supported by High Level Champions

WHAT NEXT FOR THE SDC

- How to raise awareness to UITP members of the public transport interventions in the NDC's? Role of the SDC?
- Should the SDC help to identify policy mechanisms that work e.g. on green buses?
- What can we do to support national reporting on the SDGs – links to the Charter?
- Any other areas of work to support implementation?
- What should be in the SDC 2017-2019 Work Programme?
