






Laval's Sustainable Mobility Plan is:

- A series of measures all geared toward reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions related to transportation for each Laval resident
- Concrete actions that will be harmonized with an ambitious implementation plan
- A comprehensive approach that calls upon the City, the STL, other decision-making levels as well as residents
- A multi-dimensional strategy made up of five lines of action



Develop the city in such a way as to minimize motor vehicle travel

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Better manage the supply of overall and incentive parking

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 Consolidate and develop employment centres in Laval, with better services

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4. Adapt the urban environment to the needs of an aging population

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Enforce consumption standards for light vehicles and ensure follow-up

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Set up the infrastructures required for using electric vehicles

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7. Electrify the STL's bus fleet as a matter of urgency

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8. Electrify commuter trains for entirely clean transportation

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9. Continue the extension of the metro to Laval


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10. Operate the Blainville-Saint-Jérôme train in the tunnel under Mount Royal
